6.2 Nelson Tasman Cycle Trails Trust

Gillian Wratt, Chair of Nelson Tasman Cycle Trails Trust, accompanied by Bill Gilbertson, provided a PowerPoint presentation on regional cycle trail networks.

The Trust requested the following be included in the Regional Land Transport Plan:

- A vision for a regional cycle network:
 Connecting communities: for social, health and active transport benefit
- A connected regional network:
 For community recreation and economic/visitor benefit
- Cycle highways CH6 and CH60
- · An annual funding allocation

Questions and discussion included:

- A designer would be engaged to undertake a high level feasibility study
- prioritisation around next projects information included counter numbers, accidents on trails was through reporting to websites and surveys
- The vision was for a guiding document for an overall strategy, which would contain priorities
- A Rabbit island link through to Mapua.

6.1 Waka Kotahi (NZTA) Update

Emma Speight, Waka Kotahi Director Regional Relationships, Greater Wellington and Top of the South, provided an update via a PowerPoint presentation.

Questions and discussion included:

- Road Safety Week 2023 theme and focus
- Vehicle reduction targets
- The timing of the opportunity for tier 2 councils to opt in to the Vehicle Kilometres
 Travelled Reduction Programme
- Speed Management Plans would come into effect from 1 July 2023
- The Nelson planned maintenance programme was back on track
- The SH6 urban corridor disruption response plan
- Ms Speight would check on the ability to drop the median barrier on SH6, the recent accident was a complex situation, but they were designed to be able to be dropped
- A speed management plan for Tahunanui Drive and Rocks Road was an option for the future
- Engagement with the local community and those directly affected was part of the focus group work - Ms Speight would check on what was taking place
- The Ruby Bay Bypass median barrier had been funded out of the Road to Zero Fund
- Audio tactile profiled road marking (ATP), the first priority would be road edges
- 40 minutes wait time for road works was outside of expectations, Ms Speight would look into this

The Chair noted that he had attended a meeting with the Waka Kotahi Board on behalf of Mayor King, which had been a valuable experience and had provided him with a good understanding of the issues facing Waka Kotahi.
