3.0 ROADING PROJECT PROGRAMME CHANGE

Report No 7395, dated 21 December 2007, file ref RTP-06-01, agenda pages 9-11 refer.

Attendance: Andrew James (Roading Engineer) presented the report.

Members of the Committee generally accepted that as Locking Street was within walking distance to the town it was important that this be progressed as soon as practicable however it was acknowledged that unless the work in relation to Tosswill Road proceeded as outlined in Option 2 of the report, the Council would be in a position where it was not able to fully utilise the Land Transport NZ Subsidy available to it.

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The meeting discussed whether or not another option for Locking Street would be to revisit the proposal to establish it as a one-way street however it was acknowledged that the outcome of the Corridor Study would have a bearing on the future of Locking Street and therefore it was not appropriate that this be further considered at this stage.

Mr James explained that the projects in relation to the upgrading of the various streets was driven by the Pedestrian Strategy which prioritised the installation of new footpaths on the basis of need and although the proposal now before the Committee changed the priority the Council's policy was still to work towards completing the work over a specific period.

The meeting discussed the Council's policy in relation to the provision of footpaths and it was agreed that as this proposal now changed the priorities it was appropriate that the Council's policies relating to roading and footpath upgrading should be reviewed as part of the forthcoming estimates process.

Recommendation to the Council

<u>THAT</u> the upgrade of Tosswill Road be brought forward to the 2007/08 financial year and constructed over two financial years;

<u>AND THAT</u> the Locking Street upgrade be included in the next LTCCP for construction in the 2009/10 financial year.

4.0 SUSTAINABLE TRANSPORT DISCUSSION PAPER – UPDATE OF THE NEW ZELAND TRANSPORT STRATEGY

The Divisional Manager Infrastructure introduced the report outlining the targets which the New Zealand Transport Strategy included and the issues which staff considered should be addressed within a submission.

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5.0 PARKING AND VEHICLE CONTROL BYLAW 2004, NO 207 AMENDMENTS TO SCHEDULES

Report No 7391, dated 7 January 2008, file ref 625731, agenda pages 26-28 refer.

Attendance: Alec Louverdis (Manager Technical Services) outlined the report.

He explained that the proposal was to install no stopping lines in various culs-de-sac around the City so as to provide sufficient turning room and safe entry and exit for trucks, particularly those collecting refuse and recyclables.

He pointed out that all culs-de-sac in new subdivisions are required to have no stopping lines installed around the head.

Concern was expressed that there appeared to be no consultation considered in relation to affected residents particularly in those dead end streets which relied on on-street parking more so than a newly designed subdivision.

The Manager Technical Services stressed that the culs-de-sac had been evaluated on a one by one basis and the proposal by no means represented a blanket prohibition.

It was agreed that the Manager Technical Services should ensure that a letter was sent to all those residents affected by the proposed no stopping lines prior to any work being undertaken.

It was acknowledged that this letter should be carefully worded to ensure that the residents were not left with the feeling that any concerns which they might otherwise have were irrelevant.

7.0 85 PRINCES DRIVE – PROPOSED ROAD STOPPING

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Attendance: Ian Morrison (Business Assets Advisor) presented the report.

A query was raised as to whether there were opportunities for the Council to be proactive in relation to the disposal of unwanted or unneeded road reserve.

Mr Morrison advised that in a lot of instances where residents had expressed a wish to obtain the land they were deterred by the costs inherent in the exercise, and if Council was to be proactive then it would bear the costs relating to the survey and legalisation procedure, which would likely mean that the exercise was uneconomic.

The Chief Executive advised that the staff periodically reviewed areas of unneeded Council land and wherever possible efforts were made to realise its potential.

Recommendation to the Council

<u>THAT</u> the Chief Executive be delegated the authority to complete the road stopping for about 125m² of unformed legal road adjoining 85 Princes Drive (Lot 2 DP 373816), and to sell that land to the adjoining owners as an amalgamated title, subject to the adjoining owners paying for:

- i) The value of the land as assessed by a registered valuer
- ii) The valuation, legal and survey costs incurred by Council
- iii) An administration fee of \$400 plus GST.
