## If you're going to the All Blacks game, take the bus and get there early!

Nelson City Council will be running extra FREE buses between Richmond, Stoke and Nelson to get you to the All Blacks game and home again. Leave the car at home, relax and enjoy the pre-match entertainment before the game! With over 20,000 people coming to the game you won't want to be stuck finding a car park.

All NBus services will be FREE from noon until midnight on game day, 8 September 2018.

From 2.30pm through to 5.45pm there will be extra services running every 15 minutes on NBus routes 1 and 2 from Richmond, Stoke and Nelson to the Whakatu Carpark behind the NBus depot in Bridge St. From there it's a short walk to the market in Trafalgar St and to the game.

These free buses will stop at all the usual bus stops on Routes 1 and 2 so just walk to your local bus stop or park close to the bus route.

**Getting home** 

Free buses will be waiting in the Whakatu Carpark behind the NBus depot in Bridge St, running regularly from 10pm until 11.30pm to take you back home.

From midnight until 3.30am, the Late Late Bus will be running every 30 minutes on its usual route to Stoke and Richmond via Tahunanui. A \$4 fare will apply to services

The city and the roads will be busy on game day so we recommend you come into Nelson early and enjoy the

### **Broadgreen Historic House** exhibition marks 125 years of women's suffrage

Have you ever wondered what life was like in 1893, when New Zealand women won the right to vote?

The latest exhibition at Broadgreen Historic House, The Suffragists at Home gives Nelsonians an opportunity to step back in time and take a closer look at life inside a New Zealand house 125 years ago.

On 19 September 1893, after submitting a petition with nearly 32,000 signatures, New Zealand became the first self-governing country to grant women the vote.

Suffragists at Home: Stitching and styles for a cause provides visitors with the chance to see women's stitched crafts, clothing and accessories used in the quest to help New Zealand women get the vote.

The exhibition took five months to prepare, with some intricate clothing pieces taking 10 hours each to make. Suffragists at Home provides the opportunity to gain a rare insight into life in 1893.

Chair of the Community Services Committee Gaile Noonan says it is important that we don't take things like the right to vote for granted.

"Life was hard for women in the past, and yet they still had the courage to pursue the women's vote. We should be encouraging all women to exercise their hard-won right to vote," savs Councillor Noonan.

"I can imagine the conversations they were having when they were stitching. I would love to have been a fly on the wall to listen to all their radical plans.

Downers propose to temporarily close the roads listed below for road maintenance works.


 Parkers/Bolt Road Roundabout -7am Tuesday 25 September until 10pm Thursday 27 September.

The Pines Volleyball Club will be promoting this new area, to bring big beach volleyball tournaments back to Nelson.


With the new courts positioned right next to a cafe, playground, and toilet and shower facilities, it's the ideal spot for beach volleyball tournaments.

#### **Road closures for All Blacks** test match

Under the Local Government Act 1974, notice is given that Tasman Rugby Union and Nelson Regional Development Agency will temporarily close the roads listed below to ordinary traffic for the All Blacks Game and City Activation.

- Hathaway Terrace, Hathaway Carpark and Trafalgar Park Lane from 6am on 7 September until 11pm 8 September 2018.
- Paru Paru Road from 6am until 11pm on 8 September 2018
- Trafalgar Street (SH6-Halifax Street), Wainui Street, Grove Street (Trafalgar Street-Collingwood Street) and Elliott Street from 4pm until 11pm on 8 September 2018
- Trafalgar/Halifax Intersection closed as required from stadium exit approximately 9.15pm until 11pm on 8 September 2018.
- Trafalgar Street (Bridge Street-Hardy Street), Hardy Street (Church Street-Collingwood Street) Park Street and Hope Street from 11am until 7pm on 8 September 2018.
- Trafalgar Street (Hardy Street Selwyn Place), Wakatu Carpark from 11am until midnight on 8 September 2018.
